September Reflection - Canon Victor Darlington

Beloved Friends, Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Welcome back to school. I trust many of you have had a restful holiday and have returned refreshed to begin a new academic year.

September seems packed with a range of celebrations, events and activities. We begin the month of September with the Season of Creation, starting on 1 September and finishing on the feast of St Francis, 4 October. 'During this season we are encouraged to pray and engage in community events to deepen our relationship with God, our neighbour and the earth we share, being ever more attentive to the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor.'

In the Church's liturgical calendar, we remain in ordinary time. We look forward to the celebration of the birthday of our Mother Mary on 8 September. In a providential way this year for us, we join Catholics all over the country on this most sacred day to celebrate Education Sunday. The theme for 2024 is, "He makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak", taken from St Mark's Gospel (7:31-37). The Catholic Bishop's Conference of England and Wales said: "Education Sunday falls on the second Sunday of September) just as the new academic year starts. It is one of the oldest Days of Special Prayer in England and Wales, established 175 years ago in 1848. It provides an opportunity to celebrate and give thanks to all involved in making Catholic schools places of enlightenment, as well as to look forward in anticipation of the year ahead."

On the 14th, we will celebrate the Exaltation of the Cross. The Entrance Antiphon for that day is taken from Saint Paul's letter to the Galatians Chapter 6 Verse 14, where he said: We should glory in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, in whom is our salvation, life and resurrection, through whom we are saved and delivered.'

In a way, I like the idea that September ends with the celebration of Saint Jerome on the 30th. He was a Priest and Doctor of the Church. It was Saint Jerome who translated the Bible into Latin. Saint Jerome, Patron saint of translators, librarians and encyclopedists, pray for us.

Keep giving your best in all you do; we appreciate the excellent work you are doing.

Length of service as a foundation governor/director in one school.

Please be aware Foundation Governors/Directors can only serve a maximum of three terms of office i.e. 12 years in one school. After 12 years you are welcome to become a Foundation Governor/Director at any other school in the Diocese.



Cyber Security Check up for Schools (DfE/SWGfL)

Cyber security is a frequent topic here on the briefing. The reason for that is because of its essentiality to the security of the modern educational establishment. What we could call the 'E-estate' of the 21st century school, is every bit as important as the integrity of the ground estate. All files pertaining to pupil records, safeguarding records, government information and all other aspects are now digitised. Taken together this makes a cyber break in as dangerous as a traditional break in.

CyberSecure is a free to use self-assessment tool for schools aimed at erecting an improved barrier between the e-state, and those who wish to infiltrate it. DfE offers funding to establish 300 school-based nurseries (SBN)

Last Thursday (17th October), the Department for Education announced the launch of funding to establish 300 school-based nurseries (SBN).

Between 17 October and 19 December 2024, state-funded primary-phase schools will be able to apply for up to £150,000 of capital funding to upgrade spare space to create or expand onsite nurseries. These nurseries can be school-run or delivered by private and voluntary providers or childminders on the school's site. They can also cater for any early years age group, providing there is local demand.
