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## Reflection from Canon Victor Darlington, Episcopal Vicar for Education

Beloved Friends, Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Welcome back to school. I trust many of you have had a restful holiday and have returned refreshed to begin a new academic year.

September seems packed with a range of celebrations, events and activities. We begin the month of September with the Season of Creation, starting on 1 September and finishing on the feast of St Francis, 4 October. 'During this season we are encouraged to pray and engage in community events to deepen our relationship with God, our neighbour and the earth we share, being ever more attentive to the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor.'

In the Church's liturgical calendar, we remain in ordinary time. We look forward to the celebration of the birthday of our Mother Mary on 8 September. In a providential way this year for us, we join Catholics all over the country on this most sacred day to celebrate Education Sunday. The theme for 2024 is, "He makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak", taken from St Mark's Gospel (7:31-37). The Catholic Bishop's Conference of England and Wales said: "Education Sunday falls on the second Sunday of September) just as the new academic year starts. It is one of the oldest Days of Special Prayer in England and Wales, established 175 years ago in 1848. It provides an opportunity to celebrate and give thanks to all involved in making Catholic schools places of enlightenment, as well as to look forward in anticipation of the year ahead."

On the 14th, we will celebrate the Exaltation of the Cross. The Entrance Antiphon for that day is taken from Saint Paul's letter to the Galatians Chapter 6 Verse 14, where he said: We should glory in the

Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, in whom is our salvation, life and resurrection, through whom we are saved and delivered.'

In a way, I like the idea that September ends with the celebration of Saint Jerome on the 30th. He was a Priest and Doctor of the Church. It was Saint Jerome who translated the Bible into Latin. Saint Jerome, Patron saint of translators, librarians and encyclopedists, pray for us.

Keep giving your best in all you do; we appreciate the excellent work you are doing.

#### Action Required: FAO of all MATs and Single Academy Trusts. Land and Buildings Collection Tool 2024

It is the time of year when academies are required to make their return to the DfE on their land and buildings. The LBCT window is open from 8 October 2024 until 12 November 2024.

The diocese needs to receive the returns in order to give the diocesan checker sufficient time to check them and deal with any issues arising, prior to the window closing. We welcome returns as soon as possible but the last date for submitting them to us will be Monday 4 November 2024.

Ideally Lyle will be fully aware of any capital work carried out in the school as you will have sought approval, but just in case anything else needs reviewing, please do not leave this work to the last minute. The DfE have already loaded previously entered data on the Tool ready for this year.

The department has advised that they will be holding an online LBCT power hour on 17th October 2024 to assist with the completing of the LBCT and as soon as we have the link, we will share it with you.

# Action Required: Additional Nursery Places

You will be aware of the government's pledge to create an additional three thousand nursery places. The DfE will, in the coming months, be setting out plans to use surplus capacity in primary schools to create or expand nurseries run from school premises which will include both school-run nurseries and schools partnering with private, voluntary, and independent providers.

The department is working closely with schools, local authorities, and providers to:

- understand what is needed to deliver this
- ensure provision meets the needs of families and schools
- reflect the LA's role in managing childcare sufficiency in funding decisions

Guidance for schools in relation to these proposals will be available in due course but in the meantime, please be aware that schools must have the consent of their diocese or religious order (if relevant) before taking any steps. Matters of provision be it type (nursery, resource sixth form etc) or size are matters for the Education Committee to approve. You must obtain any relevant consents from ourselves or religious order before taking any steps in this regard and that early consultation is paramount.

# NPQ Places

There is still time to apply for fully-funded NPQ places in Senior Leadership or Leading Behaviour and Culture.



The Avila Partnership (the partnership of Ursuline High School, Wimbledon and St Philomena's Catholic High School for Girls, Carshalton) has a limited number of places available starting in Autumn 2024.

The courses are run in association with The Church of England and Catholic Education Service and are nationally recognised qualifications, accredited by the Department for Education.

Fully funded places are available to teachers and leaders from the 50% of schools with the highest proportion of students who attract pupil premium funding. **Apply now to secure a place**- Register for a national professional qualification (education.gov.uk)

The deadline for applications is Friday 27th September but funded spaces are likely to go before then.
