What does freedom look like?	As we gather we invite you to pause and think about what freedom looks like to you. If you would like to write or draw something on one of your post it notes you can.
Gather	Suggested music: Where the Spirit of the Lord is, Hillsong Worship or Freedom is coming, Hillsong United Young and Free.
	Now we're going to hear the passage from the Gospel of Luke. This passage has been specifically chosen to help us understand the Jubilee.

	Jesus Begins His Ministry
Scripture reading Luke 4: 14-21 (ESV)	¹⁴ And Jesus returned in the power of the Spirit to Galilee, and a report about him went out through all the surrounding country. ¹⁵ And he taught in their synagogues, being glorified by all.
	Jesus Rejected at Nazareth
	¹⁶ And he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up. And as was his custom, he went to the synagogue on the Sabbath day, and he stood up to read. ¹⁷ And the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written,
	 "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, "to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."
	²⁰ And he rolled up the scroll and gave it back to the attendant and sat down. And the eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him. ²¹ And he began to say to them, "Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing."
